What will happen in the assessment session at the office?

*Initial assessments are usually completed at the office where we have more assessment resources.



When you come along to your first appointment the following things will happen:

- You will have the chance to explain your concerns and the speech pathologist or occupational therapist will ask you some questions about your child.
- Your child will complete some testing to determine their strengths and areas of need.
- The results of the testing will be discussed with parents and recommendations will be made. The therapist will explain options for therapy if needed, including the option for a school based service.
- Approximately 2 weeks later you will be provided with a written report and recommendations.
- An individual program can be provided for those children who have someone else who will also be working with them.

Does my child need to be seen?

Communication difficulties take many forms. Speech or occupational therapy services may be needed if your child has difficulties with learning, including:

- Saying sounds or words incorrectly.
- Following directions, listening or understanding.
- Clearly explaining their thoughts and feelings
- Difficulties with fine motor activities like writing, colouring or cutting.
- Appearing clumsy or uncoordinated.
- Difficulty learning to read, spell or write a story.
- Challenges developing social skills and the ability to get along with others.
- Being able to concentrate in noisy, busy or distracting environments.
- Not feeling calm and ready to concentrate for learning.
